Bill Solecki is professor of Geography at Hunter College, NY and former founding director of the CUNY Institute for Sustainable Cities. His research focuses on urban environmental change, resilience, and adaptation transitions, and he has supported adaptation planning for the New York and New Jersey regions. Robin Leichenko is Professor and Chair of the Department of Geography at Rutgers University and co-Director of the Rutgers Climate Institute. Robin's recent research explores vulnerability and resilience to climate change within coastal and inland communities in New Jersey and New York. Her 2008 book *Environmental Change and Globalization: Double Exposures* (co-authored with Karen O'Brien), won the Meridian Book Award from the American Association of Geographers.
